



OBJECTIVE

The 1983 annual report on birds of the Calgary area is intended as a report on observations of local interest. Each species is dealt with in some detail and, for the Calgary area birder, each species account should be of great interest. This report is a sequel to The Birds Of the Calgary Area 1982.

A report of this kind serves an important function in synthesizing the year's field data sheets and forms. Most workers would agree that the information as herein presented is significantly more available and easier to use than raw data. As stated by Sadler and Myres (1976) "With the appearance of the Victoria Natural History Society's Annual Bird Report for Southern Vancouver Island 1970 (1971 and 1972) and the Vancouver Natural History Society's Vancouver Birds in 1971 we have witnessed the initiation of annual, printed booklets on the birds of a region of Western Canada, on a hopefully continuing basis. Alberta should be able to produce similar reports, as suggested later." "A secondondary reason for this publication is to provide a model for future annual or biennial reports on the birds of Alberta that will place on permanent record data additional to that recorded here for 1961-70."


It is also hoped that this publication serves to encourage both ornithological observation in the Calgary area and the submission of those observations to the Calgary Field Naturalists' Society.

STUDY AREA

The area from which observations were considered is a circle with 80 kilometre (50 mile) radius from Calgary and is illustrated by the map opposite. This map is a portion of the 1983 Alberta Provincial Base Map. The scale is 1 cm = 10 kilometres (1" = 16 miles). For the most part observations were limited to this area. However, records of great interest which we considered to have little likelihood of publication elsewhere but were outside the area have been included.


SNOWFALL

OBSERVATIONS


The majority of the records considered are in the files of the Calgary Field Naturalists' Society (CFNS) at Inglewood Bird Sanctuary. Other records reported to the compilers verbally and considered valid have also been included.

As discussed elsewhere in this report, many rare, vagrant and accidental species require descriptive notes to increase the credibility of the record. Unfortunately, few records in this report are so supported. All notes and descriptions which were available are included in the appendix of this report.

WEATHER

Detailed data on the weather for 1983 is available from Environment Canada in its publication Annual Meteorological Summary 1983 Calgary,

Alberta. Average weekly minimum and maximum temperatures are plotted below. Weekly snowfall and rainfall are graphed on the facing page.



SPECIES ACCOUNTS NOMENCLATURE

Each species account contains the following:

- Common and scientific name according to the American Ornithologists Union Check-list of North American birds 6th edition.
- 2. May Species Count (26 & 27 May), Calgary Christmas Bird Count (18 Dec.) and Wildlife Reserve of Western Canada Christmas Bird Count (31 Dec.). For example, 160,0,6 reads 160 on the MSC, 0 on the Calgary CBC and 6 on the WRWC CBC.
- 3. Discussion of the year's records. This section is quite variable due to the variety of compilers and species. In general, individual records are specified as follows:

29 April Inglewood

(2) DE.

which reads: "On 29 April, at Inglewood, two were observed by D. Elphinstone."

In some species, data is presented as a chart showing number of records and/or number of birds per month. For example (12) 5 reads twelve birds seen in five observations.

In other species data is presented as five or ten day averages etc. The figure presented is the average number seen when seen. For example, if a species is noted on four dates in a ten day period, and the numbers were 6,8,2,4 then the ten day average is 5.

UNUSUAL RECORDS

Any records for which descriptive notes were submitted have had those descriptive notes included in the appendix of this report. These extra details are, of course, also available in the files of the Calgary Field Naturalists' Society.

The first record from the Fish Creek P.P. colony was on 2 April (6) DS with a high count of (17) on 21 April at this location EES. (2) young were also reported twice at the Fish Creek P.P heronry: 11 June DS and 25 June EES. Hwy 22 W of Calgary (18) LG until 5 Nov. Eagle Lake (200) CC. April and Oct. were the busiest months. It is interesting to note that the concentrations are greater in fall than in spring. April brought an average of (100.9) per sighting while Oct. rendered (453). Some of the year's high counts

The first spring records were at Inglewood/Chestermere (14) and Irricana (15) JS on 23 April. Numbers soon peaked with (1065) during the first week of May. The only mention of young was from Longview 18 June (4y) by EES et al. The largest summer number was seen at Sadler/Namaka on 27 Aug. (120) by JS et al (could also be the beginning of fall migration). Fall numbers were much smaller than spring; peak was during the first 2 weeks of Sept. with (156) recorded. Appendix - Descriptive Notes

- Snowy Egret 11 May Bruce Lake JWT small, pure white heron; smaller and thinner looking than Black-crowned Night Heron which was available for comparison; whilst preening distinct plumes were evident on the head; black bill; observed from 75 yards with 20-45x scope; on closer approach the bird flew with deliberate flight; broad wings; head and neck in tight curve position with yellow feet trailing behind body.
- Trumpeter Swan 1 May Irricana Sloughs DC also JS, RB seen at 100m with 20x scope; lipstick mark and a yellow eye mark noted; very chunky bird; appeared "large"; neck profile straightish; no vocalization.
- Blue-winged Teal x Cinnamon Teal 1 May Shepard/Chestermere JWT top and back of head slate blue, cheeks rusty; white vertical patch in front of eye and thin crescent behind bill; sides and breast reddish colour with Blue-winged Teal dark flecks; blue and white speculum; largish (Cinnamon Teal) bill.
- Eurasian Wigeon 2 April Strangmuir DC first noted by BLC as a "red-headed" duck; subsequent study by DC revealed a male Eurasian Wigeon swimming in a mixed flock of several thousand American Wigeon, Mallard and Pintail; the Eurasian Wigeon seemed to be associated with a particular male and (?) female American Wigeon; the bird was studied at approximately 200m with a 20x scope; red head similar to the red on a Green-winged Teal and a bright crown stripe (brighter than American Wigeon) which simple appeared light; greyish sides with a horizontal white mark; first sighted on 1 April by RW.
- Eurasian Wigeon 2 April Sec. Rd. 901 3 km. east of Strangmuir JS also RB observed for 40 minutes at 08:00 using a 20x spotting scope at 200 m; red head, cream coloured crown stripe and grey sides; first seen by RW on 1 April.

- Eurasian Wigeon 1 May S. of Shepard JWT drake; bright orange red head with cream stripe; gray sides.
- Oldsquaw 23 Oct. ACS and CFNS field trip (3) on small slough below dam at Milo were watched for several minutes through scopes, and although diving repeatedly, good views were obtained; identified by white or whitish face and sides of head and all dark back and top of wings (no wingbars); none had long tails but one which was much greyer on cheeks than others was probably an immature male; (2) were seen at MacGregor Lake by other observers.
- Surf Scoter 20 Oct. Fish Creek P.P. between Burnsmead and Bankside on Bow River EES and JFB all dark duck except for light markings on face; smaller than Mallard; observed for five minutes with 8 x 40 and 10 x 40 binocs; no white on wings above or below when wings flapped; white on face nearest base of bill was rectangular rather than round and at right angles to bill.
- Broad-winged Hawk 21 April Fish Creek P.P. EES and JFB very small chunky buteo perched 3/4 up balsam poplar inside heron colony fences; seen for five mins. through 8 x 40, 10 x 40 and 20-45 x 60

 Bushnell scope at 19:00; back dark brown; sides rusty, horizontal barring changing upwards to darker brown vertical spots/streaks; with white throat and dark face; tail very short broad and tip was dark rest of tail not seen as bird remained perched; too small to be any other buteo; tail too short to be accipiter.
- Ferruginous Hawk 1 May Irricana DC also JS, RB bird seen on ground at 20m with 20x W.A. Bushnell scope; very light bird, chestnut shoulders no belly band; flushed and observed low in flight; light unmarked tail; reddish tarsus.
- Golden Eagle 4 Nov. Bowmont Flats at 85 St. Bridge EES very large black looking bird with wide wingspan and shortish head; gliding without wingbeats; momentarily the sun lit up the golden colour on head; about 200' up; seen for about one minute without binoculars.

- Gyrfalcon 11 Nov. Cominco between Bow River and Deerfoot Trail south of
 Glenmore and north of Southland EES and JFB seen sitting
 on low stump of poplar right beside side channel of Bow River;
 viewed for 5 mins. from edge of Deerfoot at distance of 40 m
 with binocs and 20-45x scope; buteo sized but less bulky
 (comparison to 2 magpies sitting nearby); overall dark brown
 colour with a lot of white showing through especially on back,
 crown and wings; vertical barring on breast; yellow legs and
 feet; feathering appeared extensive to about half way down
 to feet; beak short, sharply hooked and dark grey except base
 which was light bluish gray; iris yellow, pupil dark; tail
 finely barred above and below; throat appeared pale; no
 obvious facial markings.
- Gyrfalcon 26 Nov. Fish Creek P.P. between Hulls Wood and Burnsmead; EES and JFB very large falcon (pointed wings) with relatively slow wingbeats (for a falcon) flew south down river; generally dark brown with white barring; head had no obvious facial markings, just dark brown; viewed for about 30 secs. as it passed by; probably the same individual seen on 11 Nov.; viewed with 8 x 40 binocs.
- Gyrfalcon 3 Dec. Hwy 1A about 10 km. west of Calgary city limits JS also DC
 seen at 08:30 for about five minutes with 10x binoculars; cloudy sky but bright light; bird was sitting on telephone pole but flew when the observers got out of car; at first thought to be a Prairie Falcon as passed by in car; on flushing with an excellent view black axillars not present; also colour was not typical Prairie Falcon brown but was more greyish; flew low with shallow wingbeats and several glides; whitish chin and throat; light supercilium; light streaking on breast; heavier streaking on belly; possibly a male as smallish.
- Hudsonian Godwit 1 May Irricana DC also JS seen at 100m with x20 WA Bushnell scope; males in breeding plumage; Marbled Godwit also present for comparison; birds also seen in flight.

- Ruddy Turnstone 15 Aug. Namaka Lake DC, BC two seen in winter plumage; seen at 20-50m also in flight; plumage pattern unmistakable; one bird in a flock of 20 Baird's Sandpipers and 1 Least Sandpiper; the other bird alone along the lake shore.
- Western Sandpiper 14 Aug. Langdon corner slough DE also ANW reddish scapulars; slightly curved down bill; dark legs.
- Western Sandpiper 15 Aug. Eagle Lake slough (SE of Eagle Lake along connecting road between Namaka L. road and Hwy 1) DC observed for 5 mins. with x20 WA Bushnell scope to the east with setting sun providing optimum lighting conditions; bird was grayish appearing all over with a hint of rust on shoulder and cap; a faint superciliary line; legs were dark; bill seemed long and drooped noticeably at end; the bird had a very horizontal posture and appeared larger than Semipalmated Sandpiper feeding a short distance away.
- White-rumped Sandpiper 28 May Slough NE of Calgary DC also JS seen at 200m with x20 Bushnell scope; similar shape to Baird's Sandpiper but breast streaking not buffy and extends down sides to legs; capped appearance i.e. distinct supercilium; rust on cap and faintly on back; white rump visible as bird flushes.
- Baird's Sandpiper 23 Oct. Cochrane Lake DC also RWS, SA lone peep associated with 2 Killdeer; dark legs; straight thin bill; buffy head and face; back appears coarsely scaly; smaller than Killdeer; buffy breast band; wings as long as or slightly longer than tail; picking at mudflat.
- Pectoral Sandpiper 21 Oct. Fish Creek P.P. DS about the size of Yellowlegs but short legs and feeding along edge rather than out in the middle; noted sharp demarcation between upper and clear lower breast; bill slightly downturned.

- Buff-breasted Sandpiper 15 Aug. Namaka Lake DC also BC seen at "eastern point" at 19:30-20:30 for a total of 20 minutes using x20 WA Bushnell scope; looking to SW at 50-100 m with a setting sun providing side/back lighting; buffy overall with unmarked underparts and belly/undertail area less buff more offwhite; back coarsely scaly looking and buffy; legs yellow to yellow-green and long; bird evidenced an eyering when first observed by DC but during subsequent study by BC the eyering was not discerned; bird had an upright stance much like an Upland Sandpiper and picked away from the water's edge up on the ridge of the spit; at no point did it approach the water's edge; short thin straight bill.
- Glaucous Gull 7 April Carburn Park ACS on a shingle bar in Bow River sitting slightly apart from a group consisting of Herring Gull,
 California Gull and Ring-billed Gull; large and whitish throughout; size at rest was about that of nearby Herring Gull; size and colour restricted the possibilities to either an immature Glaucous or Iceland Gull probably second winter; studied through 8x40 binoculars from 100-150 yards for 10 minutes; head, tail, lower back and primaries were almost pure white; upper mantle was "dirty" white; bill was pink with a black tip (20% of the bill); head and bill were noticeably large and heavier than those of a Herring Gull a few feet away; the eye was well forward in the head giving a "forbidding" aspect to the features; wingtips did not project beyond the tail.
- Long-eared Owl 28 June N.boundary Sec.31-20-1W5 DS, PS sitting on a fence post near some willow shrubs; horns and darker colour easily confirmed it wasn't a Short-eared Owl.
- Rufous Hummingbird 1 Aug. 6936 Bow Crescent NW LGa also GGa light breast and throat; green back, tail and wings; white tip on tail; getting nectar from flowers on patio; apparently nest regularly in neighbour's hedge.
- Red-breasted Sapsucker 2 Aug. Waterton N.P. DE also EG red head throughout; yellow in belly; travelled with Yellow-bellied Sapsucker; in aspen trees.

- Olive-sided Flycatcher 12 June Fish Creek P.P. WJFW; poplar and spruce woods beside Fish Creek SE of Nature Centre near 37St.; 6"; head dark to below cheeks; bill larger than for Least Flycatcher; white breast streak and dark contrasting sides; light throat; voice "whip three beers".
- Yellow-bellied Flycatcher 14 Sept. Inglewood Bird Sanctuary DE song "tsee, tsee - chebeck"; yellow in throat, breast, tail - very dull yellow; wagged tail maybe 40 times in a minute; yellow eyering.
- Western Flycatcher 19 June Fish Creek P.P. WJFW mixed woodland, edge of a clearing near Nature Centre near 37 St.; two wing bars; eyering not as predominant as Alder Flycatcher; back more olive than Alder or Least; breast olive-yellow; voice a high pitched whistle.
- Steller's Jay 19-20 Oct. Water Valley CH appeared to have more prominent crest than Blue Jay (also present); overall dark appearance; upon further observation typical black of the front of the body and the dark blue of the rear body seen; fed on wheat on the ground; observed through window at 10-12 ft.; also fed on sunflower seeds at feeder and "out-aggressed" Blue Jay.
- Steller's Jay 15 Oct. to at least 7 Dec. south of Calgary i.e. south of Fish Creek P.P. more specifically 1/4 mile east of 24th St. and Fish Creek intersection on 146th Ave. SW. RP photographs in CFNS file.
- Winter Wren 10 July Inglewood Bird Sanctuary EES also JFB attracted attention by fast trilling call; in low branches of small tree (about 6' up); very small kinglet-sized wren with very short upright tail; extremely active going around trunk and branches (almost nuthatch-like behaviour); generally bright rufous in colour with rufous breast and darker belly; seen for 2-3 mins. with 8x40 binoculars from about 10 feet by EES only (very familiar with this bird).

- Philadelphia Vireo 16 Oct. Upper Grand Valley Road approx UTM PG6395 DC also JJP observed for 20-30 mins. with 7x35 binoculars at 10:00; initial impression was of an Orange-crowned Warbler a species not unexpected even at this late date; subsequently studied at distances of 10-40 ft. as it fed and preened; over-cast with temp. of -2°C; light flat and good; in willows on edge of opening in mixed forest; white supercilium with dark line through eye and no spectacles; "heavy" vireo bill; bright yellow throat fading to a yellow wash on breast; greyish brown crown; olive back, wings and tail; no wingbars; yellowish under tail coverts although not as bright as throat; white belly.
- Orange-crowned Warbler 10 July Weaselhead WJFW poplars and willow bush beside paved trail south of Elbow River; greyish head, wings and tail; yellowish wash on breast; no wingbars or tail spots; diffuse rusty-orange crown patch clearly visible; black legs; song fairly loud trill reminiscent of Chipping Sparrow or junco; louder in the middle, slowing and descending at the end.
- Magnolia Warbler 21 Aug. Lowery Gardens DC yellow underparts and throat; gray head and back; two white wingbars; white eyering; heavy black streaking on upper part of sides; white band in tail; fuzzy grayish neckband.
- Magnolia Warbler 16 Oct. Inglewood Bird Sanctuary ACS in understory near lagoon with party of chickadees; yellow rump, white windows in tail; bright yellow breast and belly with black streaks on flanks; conspicuous white eyering; white wingbars; green back; gray band across breast just visible when looked for not at all obvious.
- Cape May Warbler 18 June Brown Lowery N.A. ACS singing male; good views obtained at close range; 50 yards from parking lot.

- Yellow-rumped Warbler 6 & 7 Dec. 2212 27th St. S.W. in Calgary JWT bright yellow rump; brownish back streaked with black; lower back greyish; head brown with yellowish patch on crown; black tail with white underspots; black wings with white edging; white-buff wingbars; white throat, breast and belly white with dark brown streaking flanks with yellowish wash; white-buffy eyering.
- Black-throated Gray Warbler 11 Aug. Inglewood Bird Sanctuary DE male; no white strip on top of head; white eyeline; no streaking on back; seen twice.
- Connecticut Warbler 5 June Fish Creek P.P. ACS attracted by loud unfamiliar song which sounded like "wittichok, wittichok, wittichok" repeated over; bird was sitting 30 feet up in poplars and remained still, giving a good view; gray head and throat; yellow underparts; complete white eyering; lack of black or gray extending down onto breast.
- Lark Sparrow 28 May Irricana DC also JS seen briefly at 50 m. with 7x35 binoculars but face pattern seen clearly.
- Swamp Sparrow 29 Sept. Prince's Island JJP one with Song Sparrow at beaver pond pond at east and south end of island; two others making similar call notes as one under observation were thought to be this species also.
- Brewer's Blackbird 20 Feb. Hwy 22x approx 2 miles west of Priddis RWS also SA seen at 25 feet with Zeiss 8x30 B binoculars; 4°C sunny; 3 adult males; showed a definite purplish irridescence covering most of their bodies.
- Red Crossbill 2 July Bow Valley P.P. DC also BC crossed bill; no wingbars; heard kip-kip call in flight and perched on spruce top; greenish-yellowish plumage.
