Issues, Events and Updates

May Species Count - Birds Results

The weekend of May 30/31 saw 109 birders out scouring the wetlands, meadows and forests within a radius of 80 Kilometers of Calgary's Center Street bridge. This huge area extends from Exshaw to Standard and from Olds to Nanton. Their efforts paid off handsomely, despite some challenging weather, to produce 210 species of birds and 50,538 individual birds. An additional 10 species were seen during count week. Thanks to all those who took part and to Andrew Hart for dealing with 150+ lists that were submitted through eBird. The list of species seen will be posted on our website.

More Trip Leaders Needed On June 16, the Nature Calgary Board agreed to resume field trips – with COVID-19 restrictions of course. By the weekend we had a good list of trips to offer members and these were quickly oversubscribed. We anticipate the trips over the next few weeks will be popular. Field Trips - Restrictions & Guidelines

The Nature Calgary Board, in the interests of the health and safety of members and the public, have adopted the following guidelines for all outings:

- Only in town outings where carpooling is not needed.
- Limited to a maximum of 10 participants.
- Pre-registration is required.
- The use of masks could be encouraged if social distance cannot be maintained.


